




As New Dances comes of age under the TDC umbrella, we celebrate 21 years and 21 Chicago-based artists: 6 Choreographers and 15 Dancers!

Choreographers



Brandon DiCriscio, of Wilmington, DE, received his initial training from Anne Marie and Sonny Leo. He then went on to pursue a B.A. in Dance at Point Park University. While in school, he apprenticed with River North Dance Chicago and then became a company member in 2007, dancing with the company through the 2011-12 season. His true passion is for dance-making, storytelling, and teaching. Brandon has set works on various Chicago-based dance companies. He looks forward to continuing to share his voice throughout the vibrant Chicago Dance Community.



Kaleigh T. Dent is a graduate from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, receiving her Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance. She is dancing with Still Inspired and Joel Hall Dancers and is a Company Member and Rehearsal Director for Identity Performing Arts. She teaches various dance styles for recreational and competition dancers in Elk Grove Village. In 2021, Kaleigh created Rivet Dance Company, a dance-for-camera, project-based company in Chicago. Recent collaboration projects include We Worship, a music video for up-and-coming gospel artist, Johanna Marie (2021), and Father, Father showcased in Trifecta Dance Collective's A New Light: Emerging Choreographer Showcase (2022).



MurdaMommy is a dancer, musician, actor, and innovator in the film, fashion, and gaming industries. As a lesbian artist and a teen who experienced homelessness, she brings her life experiences into her practice and teaches the dance form of Chicago Footwork to people who live on the South and West sides of Chicago. In 2019, she was recognized by SWAN Day Chicago, celebrating black women in dance, 2019 Dance/USA fellow and as a 2020 Queer Art Yaa Asante digital grant finalist. MurdaMommy has performed across the U.S. In Chicago, she mentors and connects with all generations through performances and workshops.



Marco Pizano is a queer, Chicago based choreographer/performer with a post-modern, North American aesthetic in movement. He has trained in techniques such as Cunningham, Ballet, and Vogue Femme. He focuses on art that centers on American LGBTQ experiences; specifically queer nightlife behavior, vogue aesthetics, drag, and how these people move through a heteronormative world. Pizano holds a BFA in Dance from Columbia College Chicago. The works of Alaska 5000 and John Waters have molded much of Pizano's artistic aesthetic and serve as inspiration constantly. When thinking about movement, Pizano is heavily inspired by nature and human behavior.



Taylor Yocum began her dance career in Spokane, Washington. She attended SUNY Purchase College and graduated in 2021. In the Fall of 2019, Taylor studied abroad at Beijing Dance Academy in Beijing, China. She has supplemented her training at summer programs with Hubbard Street Dance Chicago, Alonzo King Lines Ballet and Springboard Danse Montreal. Taylor is currently performing with South Chicago Dance Theatre. She is honored to share her choreographic voice with the world and highlight the human experience through movement.



Trey Johnson, from Saint Louis, MO, began their dance training at the Center of Creative Arts, or COCA, under the direction of Kirven and Antonio Douthit-Boyd. Trey received a BFA in Dance Performance and Choreography from the UMKC Conservatory of Dance in 2019. They have performed works by choreographers such as George Balanchine, Kevin lega Jeff, Frank Chavez, Christopher Wheeldon, Gregory Dawson, and more. Trey has danced professionally as a company member with Wylliams-Henry Contemporary Dance Company, Cerqua Rivera Dance Theatre, and Deeply Rooted Dance Theatre. Adeline K Else began pursuing the art of dance at the age of 3. They have worked with an abundance of renowned choreographers such as Julie Nakagawa, Terence Marling, Mark Caserta, Joseph A. Hernandez, Alysia S. Johnson, Meredith Dincolo, Joshua Manculich and Paige Cunningham. They have worked with DanceWorks Chicago, ESPN, "Then A Cunning Voice" by Emily Johnson and COMMON Canvas. Throughout Adeline's career, they have performed with COMMON's "Chronicle", Movement Revolution Dance Crew, The Dance Center Columbia College Chicago and Ballet Des Moines Contemporary Works. They strive to create community environments of artistry, authenticity, empathy and benevolence.



Amaya Arroyo was born in Columbus, Ohio, and began her dance training at the age of 13 years old. Amaya was a founding member of Dance ELITE Performance Academy where she trained under the direction of Samara Tillman, in modern, ballet, contemporary, jazz, and hip-hop techniques. Amaya is currently continuing her training at Columbia College Chicago working towards her BA in Dance. In addition to her studies, Amaya is an Emerging Artist at South Chicago Dance Theatre under the executive artistic direction of Kia S. Smith.



Ashley Fox, from Puyallup, WA, began her professional dance training at The International Ballet Academy under direction of Vera Altunina. She has trained with artists from the Paris Opera Ballet, New York City Ballet, American Ballet Theatre, and Vaganova Ballet Academy. At the age of 15, she moved on to train at the Moscow State Academy of Choreography (Bolshoi Ballet Academy), where she finished her classical dance training. After graduating from the Academy, Ashley moved to Chicago to train with Hubbard Street Dance Chicago (HSPro) under the direction of Alexandra Wells. Currently, Ashley is working as a freelance dance artist here in Chicago.



Ashley Rivette, from Upper Marlboro, Maryland, began her ballet training in Stuttgart, Germany. She has a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in Dance from Shenandoah University. Lisa Gonzales is a choreographer, improviser, performer and teacher. She has shown her work nationally and internationally in places and spaces such as: DTW in New York; diverse spaces in Chicago; Taipei, Taiwan; St. Petersburg, Russia; Helsinki, Finland; Puerto Plata, Dominican Republic; and Yogyakarta and Jakarta, Indonesia. Described as a performer of "stunning power and nuance" by the New York Times, she values the lessons inherent in the practice of collaboration and performance. She is co-founder of The Architects, The Movement Intensive in Compositional Improvisation, and Improvisation Assembly: Practice in Action. Gonzales is an Associate Professor and Chair of Dance at Columbia College Chicago.

Jeff Hancock performs, teaches, and designs movement and clothing to move in. Performing for River North, Hubbard Street, Same Planet, The Lyric Opera and others collided his dance and design life, and shaped his path as a teaching artist. Directors



Melissa Thodos (Thodos Dance Chicago Founder and Artistic Director) began her training at the Evanston School of Ballet, choreographing and dancing in High School, and at Skidmore College. Becoming a featured performer educator and choreographer with The Chicago Repertory Dance Ensemble, she then founded Thodos Dance Chicago (TDC) in 1992. TDC served as a platform for her choreography and other American choreographers. For 25 years, the Company performed in over 25 states and 6 continents. At TDC Melissa created an environment that trained dancers, nurtured them as choreographers, and mentored them as educators. The New Dances project has been part of TDC's structure since 2000 and has been in collaboration with DanceWorks Chicago since 2018.



Julie Nakagawa (DanceWorks Chicago Artistic Director and Cofounder), from Evanston, IL, Julie was a featured dancer with Christopher D'Amboise's Off Center Ballet, Cleveland Ballet, and Twyla Tharp Dance. Returning to Chicago upon her retirement from dancing, Julie joined the staff of Lou Conte Dance Studio in January 1994, at the invitation of Lou Conte, and rose to the position of Associate Director. n addition, she led Hubbard Street 2 from its inception in 1997 through February 2007 as the artistic director of the second company of Hubbard Street Dance Chicago, nurturing young dancers and establishing the National Choreographic Competition to provide creative opportunities for emerging dance makers. A sought-after teacher, Julie has taught classes for dance studios, university programs, and companies, nationally and internationally. She has served as a board member and officer of Dance/USA and has been a panelist for the National Endowment for the Arts. The Chicago Foundation for Women's Asian American Leadership Council honored Julie for her work in the creative arts.
